Mooting is a public speaking activity, which is based upon appellate advocacy, referred to by some authors as 'appellate simulation'.³ It is an activity that primarily, although not exclusively, is engaged in by law students or those in other degree programmes undertaking a law unit.⁴ Mooting may also be part of an internal programme conducted by student associations as a learning or professional skills activity, which is organised separately from academic activities, or run as either ...
